

Information for overnight guests

IGLOO-VILLAGE DAVOS KLOSTERS

Please read this document carefully in order to be properly prepared for the Igloo-Village experience.

Davos Klosters: a region full of opportunities with a varied range of activities, set in the middle of the beautiful Landwasser Valley but still easy to reach. The Igloo-Village at Parsenn/Weissfluhjoch – at an altitude of 2'550 m – is a pure natural idyll nestling above the traditional Graubünden holiday paradise of Davos, a pulsating leisure destination with over 10'000 inhabitants and more than 20'000 guest beds, itself 1'560 m above sea level.

Program

- until 3:30 p.m.** Travel up the mountain with the "Parsennbahn" funicular railway to the "Höhenweg" mid-point station, then change on the left side and continue to the "Weissfluhjoch" mountain station (taking a total of around 20 minutes).
- 4:00 p.m.** Arrive PROMPTLY at the meeting point at the Weissfluhjoch panorama restaurant (first floor) to be welcomed and introduced by Igloo-Village guides. Meeting point and arrival time are mandatory. Please don't go to the Igloo-Village by yourself.
- from 4:30 p.m.** Hike to the Igloo-Village (around 20 minutes' walk).
Arrival at the Igloo-Village and settle in to the igloo rooms.
Then activities in and around the igloo with aperitif, evening meal (at around 7:00 p.m.), snow-shoe trek, sauna, pool and a cosy get-together.
- 7:30 a.m.** Wake-up tea served to you in your sleeping bag, afterwards common hike to the Weissfluhjoch restaurant.
- 8:30 a.m.** Breakfast in the Weissfluhjoch restaurant and individual departure.

During your journey

Please plan enough extra time to ensure you arrive at the meeting point specified in the program on time and unhurriedly. The mountain railways are not responsible for transporting your luggage. If you are late, please let us know immediately on +41 41 612 27 28. Please have the mobile telephone you specified on reservation with you, so we can contact you if needed (especially during your outward journey).

Luggage deposit

There are no lockers at the Parsenn valley station. On the mountain there is a possibility to store not needed luggage liability excluded. We do not recommend that you take excess luggage on to the mountain. Skiers take their skis to the meeting point and will be informed by the guides.

Tip: Skiers have the possibility to go - after having been at the meeting point - directly to the igloo with the skis. In the next morning if they have a valid skipass they would have one downhill as the first skiers and would come with the first gondola directly to the breakfast.



Equipment

The Igloo-Village nestles in the heart of nature on the mountain. Make sure you are properly equipped. Normally the temperatures in the Igloo-Village remain constantly at around 0°C.

Clothing and equipment:

- Winter-proof, warm clothing (such as for skiing, see picture above)
- Comfortable, warm winter shoes (e.g. snowboard shoes or moonboots)
- Good gloves
- Dry socks, long underwear to change, possibly pyjama
- Two hats (second hat as spare hat, in case first hat gets wet)
- Towel, swimwear and flip flops for the whirlpool if required
- A torch or head torch
- Toothbrush & toothpaste
- Cash
- Sunglasses and sun cream (for outward and homeward journey)
- (Ski-) Goggles (against wind)

A backpack is the ideal item of luggage for the overnight stay in the Igloo-Village.

Please do NOT bring the following

- An expedition sleeping bag and a sleeping bag liner will be provided for you
- Suitcase (unsuitable)

How to get there

By train

The railway station at Davos-Dorf is easy and simple to get to by train. From Davos-Dorf railway station, the valley station of Parsennbahnen is about 5 minutes' walk. Visit www.sbb.ch for more information on train connections.

By car

If travelling by car, follow the signs to the railway station once you have entered the village of Davos-Dorf. Pass by the railway station and take the first left (Mühlestrasse). Car park is then signposted. Note: A night-parking ban is in force on the car park. However, it does not apply to igloo guests. On entry of the park either left or right after the entrance barrier are parking spaces marked as night parking spaces (this zone is closed off but you may drive in). This is important if snow-clearing measures are underway. Then a short walk of less than five minutes (under-pass) to the Parsenn valley station. With your booking confirmation you can purchase a night-parking ticket for the special price of CHF 10 (2x CHF 5) at the counter that you can use at the barrier in the morning when leaving the car park.

Then by mountain train

with the "Parsennbahn" funicular railway to the mid-point station "Höhenweg", then change on the left side and continue ride to the mountain station "Weissfluhjoch" (taking a total of around 20 minutes).



Mountain railway tickets

Guests using the railway without skiing equipment may purchase a regular mountain/valley trip. Guests using the railway with skiing equipment and do not start the journey up the mountain before 3:30 p.m. can purchase a single mountain trip and then need to purchase an additional ski pass for the next day. The normal ski-pass prices are charged for earlier mountain trips. A one-day adult ski pass costs CHF 73 and a return ticket for foot passengers costs CHF 40.

If you hand your two-day ski pass to the valley station by 11:00 a.m. on the morning of your departure, you will receive a partial refund.

The mountain railway tickets and any parking charges incurred are not included in any package.

Cancellation insurance

We strongly recommend that you take out cancellation insurance for overnight stays, for example with Allianz Global Assistance.

Safety information for overnight stays in the Igloo-Villages

High alpine hazards

Iglu-Dorf GmbH herewith expressly draws the attention of its overnight guests to the environment of the Igloo Village in remote, high alpine nature. Even a short walk can entail high alpine risks. High alpine hazards refer to concrete phenomena such as strong winds, cold, altitude, visibility conditions, snow and ice, sudden changes in the weather, unknown terrain, amongst others.

As the weather cannot be influenced, this can affect the activities during the overnight stay. Activities in the open air (for example visiting the whirlpool) are adapted to the weather situation, i.e. not carried out in the worst case.

Respect nature! Coordinate your activities to your abilities and physical condition and the high alpine environment. Stay overnight only if you are in good health.

Emergency management

A safety concept exists if accidents occur. Rescue transportation may take some time given the exposed location and the weather, and may even be impossible in exceptional circumstances. No rescue transport will be carried out for minor injuries. The client is responsible for any costs for rescues.

In the Igloo Village, there is an emergency chemists with disinfectant, ointment, compresses, materials for dressings, tweezers. We are not allowed to stock or issue any other materials or medicines. The guest is responsible for such items.

Leaving the Igloo Village Zugspitze during avalanche detonations

To avoid natural hazards, it may be the case that you have to leave the Igloo Village Zugspitze during avalanche detonations, even though it is not in a zone at risk of avalanche. The instruction to leave can be issued in the middle of the night. You may have to leave in the middle of the night, perhaps without being able to return to the Igloo Village, with makeshift overnight accommodation in the mountain restaurant.

Concluding remarks

Iglu-Dorf GmbH makes every endeavour to ensure that incidents can be avoided. To this end, we also rely on the cooperation of our overnight guests. Please follow the instructions and advice of the igloo guides.

The need to leave the igloo village on account of avalanche detonations is on average necessary 2-3 nights per season, based on experience from the past three years.

Restrictions to the offer do not justify any price reduction.

We finally wish to point out that after meanwhile more than 40,000 overnight guests, incidents can be counted on one hand. We shall do our utmost to make sure this remains the same. We thank you for your cooperation and look forward to enjoying a pleasant and relaxed atmosphere with you in the Igloo Village.
